Choose food and gift tags from the Giving Tree on Nov. 23, Nov. 30, and Dec. 7.


All gifts and food items except perishables need to be turned in no later than Sunday, Dec. 14.

Marcia McCowin Concert | Jan. 25 | 4pm



The Annual Marcia McCowin Concert arose from the visionary sparkle of Marcia McCowin, who designated an estate gift to St. Paul's Burlingame to highlight the work of women composers and poets. Dr. McCowin (1952-2020) was a Professor of Clinical Radiology at UCSF, a generous supporter of Music at St. Paul's, and an inspiration to all who knew her.

The 2026 concert program features the cantata *Lobgesang* (Song of Praise) by Fanny Hensel, performed by the Choir of St. Paul's and the New Century Chamber Orchestra.



The program also includes a discussion with Indian-American composer Shruthi Rajasekar and poet Mia Ayumi Malhotra on their collaboration in the anthem "O this fluted Marvel," premiered at the Christmas concert. The portraits shown here were commissioned from Dutch artist Margit van der Zwan, and are displayed as part of the composer timeline in the choir room.

Shruthi Rajasekar will be visiting St. Paul's throughout this weekend, including a workshop with St. Paul's Choristers on hymn composition.
