The First Lesson Ephesians 1:11-23

A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Church in Ephesus

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of

glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

"Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh.

"Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets."

"But woe to you who are rich,

for you have received your consolation.

"Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry.

"Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep.

"Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.





Presentation and Examination of the Candidates

Celebrant: The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents: I present Anna Kazumi Malhotra to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Celebrant: Will you be responsible for seeing that the young person you present is

brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you by your prayers and witness help this young person to grow

into the full stature of Christ?

Parents: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that

rebel against God?

Candidate and Parents: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and

destroy the creatures of God?

Candidate and Parents: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Candidate and Parents: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Celebrant: Will you who witness these promises, do all in your power to support

The Baptismal Covenant

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Father?

People I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Celebrant Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting.

Celebrant How will you remain faithful to these things?

People With God's help, by continuing in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the

breaking of bread, and in the prayers.

Celebrant How will you respond to temptation and sin in your own life?

People With God's help, by persevering in resisting evil, and whenever falling into sin,

repenting and returning to the Lord.

Celebrant How will you share Christ with the world?

People With God's help, by proclaiming by word and example the Good News of God

in Christ.

Celebrant How will you follow Christ in your daily life?

People With God's help, by seeking and serving Christ in all persons, loving my

neighbor as myself.

Celebrant How will you participate in God's redemptive work?

People With God's help, by striving for justice and peace among all people, and by

respecting the dignity of every human being.

Celebrant How will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of

the Earth and every human being?

People With God's help, by working for the just and proper stewardship of God's

creation, caring for all creatures and living things in this world.

Celebrant How will you cherish these wondrous works of God, and protect and restore the

beauty and integrity of all creation?

People With God's help and the support of community, by nurturing wonder and joy as

we partner in Christ's redeeming work for the sake of all that live.

The Celebrant says

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and forever. **Amen.**

Thanksgiving Over the Water

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People** It is right to give God thanks and praise.

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Holy One, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Celebrant touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Baptism

The candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who then pours water upon the candidate, saying

Anna Kazumi, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Anna Kazumi, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

Anna Kazumi, receive this candle and reflect the light of Christ in this world. Amen.

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Bless these financial commitments so that we, enlivened by your Holy Spirit, may share in the sacred traditions, blessings, and possibilities that flow from your generous Goodness.



The Great Thanksgiving

Eucharistic Prayer A, The Book of Common Prayer, p. 361



It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and every where to give thanks to you, Almighty God, Creator of heaven and earth. For in the multitude of your saints you have surrounded us with a great cloud of witnesses, that we might rejoice in their fellowship, and run with endurance the race that is set before us; and, together with them, receive the crown of glory that never fades away.

Therefore, joining with Angels and Archangels and with the faithful of every generation, we lift our voices with all creation as we sing:



The Celebrant continues the Eucharistic Prayer, giving thanks for God's work of redemption through Jesus Christ and consecrating the bread and wine for Holy Communion. The people join in sacramental witness, speaking to the mystery of God's saving grace.

... Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, Most Holy God, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling Christ's death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in Christ. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us and all your saints into the joy of your eternal Reign.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory are yours, Most Blessed One, now and forever. **AMEN**.

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name,

thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
